PRESIDENT'S LETTER

At the Center, and around the world...

Dear Friends of the Animals,

The last few months have been a whirlwind of activity for Helen Woodward Animal Center as we close in on the end of the year. I am again reminded of how special the Center is and how unique we are in the ways that we reach out to support those working in animal welfare to connect across states and countries to make a difference for orphan pets.

In September I traveled to Poland to speak at the International Companion Animal Welfare Conference on behalf of my friends at Dog's Trust in the UK. I was honored to be there representing Helen Woodward Animal Center and I was humbled by the needs of those we met and the challenging situations they face. Whether talking to friends from Morocco and Zimbabwe who are dealing with the horrors of the culling of street dogs by local governments, or meeting with colleagues from Estonia and Romania who are desperate for support and inspiration to keep them going when they feel they are all alone in their fight, I am reminded that we all must work together if we want the future to be different for our animal friends.

There is hope in so many people who care so much but they lack resources, ideas and support and they need our help. After that conference I committed myself and my team to making a difference for groups around the world — if they can get 100 + animal welfare workers in any one place, we will be there to share our best practices for everything from adoptions to social media to fundraising and public relations. That's my pledge to make a difference for animals in this world.

Remember Me Thursday[®] is another way that we bring the world together for orphan pets and this year we gathered over 70 celebrities to share this critical message to remember those who have lost their lives in shelters and those still waiting for their forever homes. Close to 180 countries responded to the call and animal groups worldwide shared the message in their own way.

Blue Buffalo's Home 4 the Holidays[®] international adoption campaign followed closely behind with shelters around the world encouraging families to bring home a rescue pet this holiday season and all the holidays to come. The numbers are still coming in but we expect close to 1.5 million animals to find their forever homes this year.

None of this amazing work for our animal friends is possible without you and I thank you from the bottom of my heart and I ask you to please include the Center in your year-end giving as you read about dogs like Blanca and so many thousands of others that receive life-saving care each day at Helen Woodward Animal Center. We can only do the work we do because of your generosity. Blanca's story

Banca was a sweet little terrier blend that came to Helen Woodward Animal Center from Corona, California with seven 13-day-old puppies and a frightening health situation; Blanca had cancer.

This new mother had been through so much, giving birth on the streets of Corona and trying to provide care for her puppies while battling cancer. When this beautiful mom dog came to the Center we knew that we had to do everything possible to give her a second chance at happiness and a safe and happy home.

There was no hesitation when we learned of her condition. Through her regular treatments we continue to do everything



possible to give her the best quality of life including trying all different types of food until we found one that appealed to her appetite after chemotherapy treatments. This "super mom" deserved every chance we could give her for a healthy life, so after getting her into a loving foster home where she and her puppies could rest and recuperate from all they had been through we began chemotherapy for Blanca's cancer.



Animal Health Supervisor Lucas Kodama, and Veterinary Assistant Tyler Wetzel administer Blanca's first treatment through an IV catheter. Since beginning her chemotherapy Blanca's cancer has shrunk considerably.

Today, six of Blanca's seven puppies have been adopted to wonderful loving homes. The seventh puppy has a respiratory infection and has been receiving the best care possible for her recovery. She will soon be placed in her forever home, as will Blanca once she completes her treatment and receives a clean bill of health. We are all counting down to the "big day!" &

Remembering the Rescue...

IT'S BEEN ANOTHER AMAZING AND

INSPIRING YEAR for two original Helen Woodward Animal Center adoption awareness campaigns, Remember Me Thursday[®] and Blue Buffalo's Home 4 The Holidays[®]. Remember Me Thursday, now in its sixth year, continues to light up the world, sending the message that all orphan pets deserve to live in loving homes, not die in shelters waiting. Meanwhile, Home 4 The Holidays is reinforcing its focus this season on helping rescue organizations find homes for more orphan pets than ever before during the holiday season.

Remember Me Thursday, celebrated yearly on the fourth Thursday of September, made waves in 2018 near and far. More than 80 celebrity and animal supporters shared the campaign with their hundreds of thousands of followers on social media, including this year's campaign spokesperson, American music icon and five time Grammy winner, Wynonna Judd. Other celebrity endorsers included, Katherine Heigl, Rick Springfield, Kristin Chenoweth, David Backes, Liam Hendricks and Ryan Newman.

Candle lighting events were held throughout the country. In Indiana, the Michiana Humane Society lit up dozens of luminaries in honor of orphan pets who never found their forever home. In Wausau, Wisconsin, the Humane Society of Marathon County gathered the community for a heartfelt candle lighting ceremony. Dozens of other events around the nation included poem readings, proclamations and even animal blessings.

Remember Me Thursday also transcended overseas with animal advocates in 180 countries sharing the campaign's message on social media or holding events. In Bulgaria, two massive Remember Me Thursday flags were raised for orphan pets. Some of the most thought-evoking messages about Remember Me Thursday came from the youngest of advocates. The winning submission for an inaugural multi-media contest in schools came from a 4th and 5th grade class at Los Penasquitos Elementary School in Poway, CA. In Puerto Rico, the students at Abbys School in Culebra spent the day learning what they can do for homeless animals.

Another first for Remember Me Thursday this year was the Rescue Pet Hero Award. We set out to show the world the incredible abilities of rescue dogs. We found Yeti, a pit bull from central Arizona and were touched by his story. He was returned to a shelter twice before finally being adopted. Soon after, he saved his 7-year-old human brother from drowning in a river. His family received a year's supply of Blue Buffalo dog food.



Blue Buffalo's Home 4 The Holidays adoption campaign is in full swing. This season, we are aiming to find homes for close to 1.5 million orphan pets worldwide. A big focus this year for the Center is to ensure the 4,000 animal rescue organizations taking part in the campaign have the tools to meet their adoption goals. Right now, organizations can enter the Home 4 The Holidays Media Award by telling us what they're doing to garner media attention in their efforts to promote adoptions. The winning submission will get \$25,000 or a new rescue van!
